

## Hello Vineyard!

Isn't it cool when Sunday teachings line up perfectly with where you're at in life? That is certainly the case for me with our current series, "The Way In is the Way On." A little over a month ago, I was at the end of my rope: overwhelmed by my list of seemingly impossible tasks and thoroughly exhausted. I'm so grateful that Jesus met me there with rest and to **lead me through it by leading me in**. He didn't tell me what to "fix" in my exhausting circumstances. Instead, He lovingly revealed a deeply held idol in my life (called "the plan") that was enslaving and exhausting me. He walked me through turning away from it and letting it go, which was a beautiful experience!

Now I'm approaching my role in the church with more freedom than I've ever experienced. But I still sometimes look at our church transitioning in so many areas and think with frustration, "Why is this taking so long, Jesus? What is the plan here?" As I ask him this, if I allow him to gently turn my attention to Himself, I see that He is not anxious, frustrated, or in a rush (like I am). He reminds me that He is working in SO MANY WAYS under the surface in all of our lives, moving us closer to Him and laying a stronger and better foundation for our church. He lovingly reassures me that this is HIS church, not ours. And He says to me yet again, "Emily, you don't NEED a plan, because I have the plan. You only need to stay close to me." After hearing this more times than I can count, I find myself trusting Him more and more with the timeline. And as I do, He's teaching me how to be led by Him: unrushed and non-anxious like Him. It seems He is doing that with many people in our church family right now, which is also so beautiful!

# **Ministry Area Check-Ins**

#### VCC Kids

While we wait on God to show us the way through the leadership transition in VCC Kids, it has been so great to continue to get to know these awesome little humans – they are hilarious, sweet, and full of energy, life and curiosity. **One of the main things on our hearts for the kids in our church is that more of YOU would be connected to more of them.** We continue to feel God leading us toward more integration for the kids into the whole body. ## Youth

With five incoming middle schoolers, our group has grown in numbers and energy for this school year! #### **Compassion & Justice**

We've had a couple of Sundays in recent months when our friends from the Waymakers have joined us for baptisms and some of you are now consistently volunteering at the food pantry during the week. We also had over 20 of us serving and deepening relationships there at this past Saturday's Service Day & Mini Retreat. Our growing connection has been a huge blessing. **As the holidays approach,** we're heading into a season of generosity as a church. ## <u>Leadership Structure Assessment Team (LSAT)</u>

Have you ever experienced a time when God did something so deep and so unexpected in you that you had trouble explaining it to others? This is what we are experiencing on the LSAT. We were formed by Pastoral Council in 2021 to assess our church's leadership structure and recommend changes. As we sought God together about our leadership structure, he answered us in a way that none of us expected: by taking us on a transformational journey as individuals and as a group in learning how to pursue His will together. This has certainly taken a lot longer than any of us expected, but God is showing us more clearly how this will impact everything and we're actively seeking Him on how to invite the whole church into this journey. - After a long process of prayerful consideration, **Jill & Tyler Campo** felt led to explore a different church home for their family. We're incredibly grateful for their time here and for the many ways they have served. We will miss their family, but are so thankful for the relationships we continue to have with them.

## **VCC & Rongai Vineyard in Kenya**









Our journey with the Rongai Vineyard, near Nairobi Kenya, began about three years ago through VCC member, Emmanuel Mwambaza, who was helping his close friend and mentor, Aimable, with a bible study he was leading for other refugees in Kenya. With David Stark's guidance and the involvement of the Association of Vineyard Churches of Kenya, Aimable planted the Rongai Vineyard in 2021. Since then, the congregation has grown to around 130 members. Through Emmanuel and his trip to minister to this new church in late 2022, our church has forged a partnership with them. For a refugee in Kenya, providing basic necessities such as food, education, and healthcare is exceptionally difficult. Just in the past six months, we have been able to assist Aimable and the Rongai Vineyard in various ways:

- We provided funds for Pastor Aimable and his leaders for conferences and biblical training.
- We funded the Rongai elders to purchase and distribute food to 16 families in the church facing severe food shortages.
- We coordinated with an educational organization in Kenya to identify children in the church in need of tuition support, allowing us to sponsor 38 children/youth for the upcoming year.
- We're currently supporting Pastor Aimable with a serious skin condition requiring surgery.


## The "Numbers" Section

Our 2023 financial goals are to fund our operating expenses, pay for small-scale building projects, and put another \$75K towards the building loan principal. **We are currently ~\$13K behind** the pace on reaching this goal as of Sunday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>. *The VCC Board plans to send a more thorough financial update in late November*.


