Ministry Area Check-Ins

VCC Kids

What a blessing to serve and walk alongside the youngest at VCC! As we look to the holidays, we are actively exploring ways to help our children understand the importance of Christ's birth and look for opportunities to serve those around us both at VCC and our broader community. **Please be praying** that our kids can grow in their knowledge and experience of Jesus, in addition to forming greater community with one another.

Youth Group

We're really excited that God is raising up student leaders in our group! This semester, we're exploring and refining a new format (every other Tuesday & Friday) as the youth continue to take ownership and leadership. **Please pray** for the continued work of the Holy Spirit on our Friday night gatherings, building community on our Tuesday nights, and also for Reverb (February youth conference.)

Compassion & Justice

God is leading us more and more into relational engagements with our C&J partners, creating opportunities for a more personal ministry. We're working on ways to follow His lead with our holiday outreaches (see the "upcoming this quarter" section below) and building that into how we engage with our partners in 2023.

Please pray for La Vina and Bluefields. The situation in Nicaragua continues to be troubling as the aging dictator is tightening his grip on the country. The school has lost a third of its students over the past three years (330 to 220 currently) as people have had to flee the area for safety or for opportunity (jobs).

Worship

God continues to deepen our relationships on the worship team as we work (and play!) together. It feels like God is deepening and freeing up our worship space on Sundays, and our worship together continues to be such an honor and joy for those of us on the team. Worship Circles are done for the year due to the holiday season coming up in November and a December, but we will have a Christmas Caroling evening in December, date TBD. Please pray for our continued renewal in the Holy Spirit as we keep leading worship on Sundays, running rehearsals and leading and working with the kids and youth in worship as well. Everyone on the worship team leads busy lives and puts in a lot of time for the church. It's easy to get caught up in busyness and miss the quiet, calm pace of our God.

Leadership Structure Assessment Team (LSAT)

This team was formed last year to assess our current leadership structure for where God is taking us next as a church. In the past year, they have reviewed the current structure and are looking at proposed leadership models. To learn more about discerning together, they are currently working through the book, "Pursuing God's Will Together," by Ruth Haley Barton. A more thorough update will be given by LSAT members, including a time for Q&A, at the upcoming Community Check-In on November 20.



Giving vs. Expenses

Our 2022 financial goals are to fund our operating expenses and pay down \$100,000 on the building loan. **We are \$38,645 behind** the pace on reaching this goal as of Sunday, October 23rd. *The VCC Board plans to send a more thorough financial update in late November.*


Attendance Averages by Quarter:
